### Attendance Updates for Autumn Term

Following new DFE guidance 'Working together to improve school attendance', we will be monitoring attendance in a slightly different way in schools, this takes effect from 19th August 2024, our trust attendance policy will reflect these changes where appropriate.

We will be issuing letters inviting parent / carers to a meeting when we notice changes to attendance, this could be due to unauthorised absences or noticing that your young person is coming in late to school more often.

In the first instance these meetings will be held with Ms Emma O'Hara (Pastoral Lead) if we are not seeing an improvement then Mr Patrick Hamilton (Head of School) will chair the subsequent meetings. We aim to work with you in finding ways to break down the barriers in school attendance and discuss any referrals that may be needed to help support.

The work we do around attendance is alongside our designated Educational welfare officer (EWO) from the local authority and Mr Graham Alcock SENDAT Attendance Lead.

# Trauma informed approach:

At Sunrise, there are currently 4 members of staff who are trauma and mental health practitioners, having gained Level 5 Diplomas in Trauma informed schools, 3 of which are located within the pastoral team.

## Trauma informed practices involve:

- Realising the widespread impact of trauma and understanding paths for recovery.
- Recognising signs and symptoms of trauma.

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- Integrating knowledge about trauma into policies, procedures, and practices.
- Creating a safe and caring environment.
- Avoiding re-traumatisation.
  - Focusing on safety, trustworthiness, choice, collaboration, and empowerment

# Careers – Ms Vanstone

- This terms highlight has seen Speaker John Burton from inside connections come and speak to year 8,9,10 and 11 on the impact of a life of crime, including his personal experiences of being in a category A prison for 23 years. On leaving prison John has devoted life to steering young people, from schools and prisons, away from crime and into a trade instead.
- We have also had visitors from the Job centre plus to work with years 8,9,10,11 specifically looking at the changing world of work, with workshops on future skills and interview techniques. With college interviews happening currently for our young people this was vital and well received by our pupils who engaged with the workshops in a really positive and mature way.
- Some Farming news, in that a local farmer will visit Primary pupils with his tractor for the pupils to look at and learn about farming careers in the new year, alongside a visit to a food and farming day where years 7-11 can learn about local food and farming career options and take part in interactive workshops, this will be in the spring term.
- One more exciting prospect is a collaboration of Sunrise and Creative Arts East where they are to come to school 2 hours a week for 10 weeks in order to work together with our years 7-11 students to learn the skills of a music promotor and put on a gig at the Marina Theatre. This is a massively positive project fully funded by Creative Arts East which will furnish pupils that take part with communication skills, skills in budgeting problem solving and many more strengths to put on their CVs on leaving school.

# Key Stage 2

### English

This half term students have been reading the text 'The Moon Man'. They have been considering different cultures and the experiences they may have as they experience the world. Students have written letters, taken part in role play and even took part in a pretend court case to decide the fate of the Moon Man.

### Maths

Students have been developing their knowledge of area, perimeter and their times tables. They have been solving word problems and taking part in investigations putting all their knowledge to practise.

### Topic

This half term students have learnt about natural disasters and extreme weather. Students have explored fault lines, tsunamis, voclanoes, flooding, droughts and the impact on the people and areas that they happen to.

In English this term we have focused on our 'SPAG' learning. This has mostly been recapping our grammar and punctuation placement and creating some independent writing to show off these basic fundamentals of Literacy learnt this term. We have also supported each others learning and given each other feedback to improve on. Great peer work! Autumn 2 we have studied the novel 'Holes'. Students enjoyed analyzing characters, looking at comparing and similarities to other texts and reading small parts to

support our reading capabilities.

### Mathematics

In Maths this term we have focused on Number place value and recappe previous years. We have looked and comparing and writing numbers to

We have used some practical resources such as a number square and Base 10 to support our knowledge during our learning.

Autumn term 2, we have looked at addition and subtraction. Exploring themes of problem solving real life equations to support our understanding better.

Science – Getting introduced to science, learning about cells and human body.

> **PE** – Students during PE have been focusing on specific techniques and skills within Football to improve on strengthening their gross motor skills alongside qualities such as sportsmanship. On Friday mornings, students have had the opportunity to walk to the local park where we have been working on road safety, and other real-life skills before completing PE theory on being able to identify the muscles in the body.

In PSHE students have been looking at Who am I? First impressions and family factors.

Art - students are exploring the theme identity. Students have been looking at exploring 3D modelling skills.

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
