Residence

What is residence all about?

Chalk Hill provides a Residential provision that's available from Monday to Friday morning which is split into two services known as boarding and Link. Our boarding service, which is the main service we offer, provides after school and overnight care, learning and activities for up to 12 pupils per night.

Our Link provision which runs alongside boarding until 19.00 each evening when our Link pupils are collected by parents and return home rather than staying overnight in boarding. Link helps pupils' get use to staying in residence overnight and for those who are unable to come to residence due to difficulties linked to health needs.

What do children do/learn in residence

What we learn in residence:

- Independence skills: Doing things by yourself....
- Social skills: Being a good friend....
- Healthy eating: Eating good foods.....
- Mental health awareness: Feeling happy and calm.....
- Physical health: Staying strong and active.....
- Personal hygiene: Keeping clean.....
- Problem-solving skills: Figuring things out....
- Community involvement: Helping out where you live

What's the food like in residence?

In residence we try to make sure that all the meals are healthy and add to a well-balanced diet. We understand that some young people may struggle with some foods and where we can, we will cater for their individual needs. These are the meals you will normally have in residence:

If I would like to join residential, what must I do?

If your parent/carers and you would like to join residence, then they should complete a referral form requested through our main office or the Residence Head of Care. Residential Care Leader, Byron Higgins, will discuss the appropriate, with the residential team, the class teacher, pupil and family support team and with the parent/carer. If the referral is deemed appropriate, then further discussions will identify the type of provision most suitable for the pupil and a timescale for the young person to join residence.



Chalk Hill provides programmes for pupils up to 5 days a week in term time based upon the following principles.

- ❑ We are committed to working with parents, carers and statutory agencies to agree a set of objectives for each pupil's placement. These objectives of the school placement plan will be reviewed on a regular basis.
- ❑ We will co-work with social care, health and the voluntary organisations and is committed to developing innovative non-discriminatory practice.
- ❑ Each residential pupil will have an identified key worker.
- ❑ Pupil's parents and carers will have an identified key worker.
- ❑ Pupils, parents and carers will be supported so that there are effective communications and home/school links. Parents and carers are encouraged to visit school and participate in activities and decision-making with the pupils.
- ❑ Chalk Hill is committed to recognition of pupil's rights and needs. The school will actively listen to pupils and parents' views and take account of these. The school will have in place a complaints procedure, strategies to prevent bullying, and a pupil's council.
- ❑ We provide a safe environment for pupils and encourage and support pupils to make appropriate and informed choices about their lives and futures.
- ❑ We will support pupils to access a range of community resources/activities to develop self confidence, independence and citizenship.
- ❑ A key aspect of residence is improving educational achievement, and the school will encourage homework and after-school learning to further develop the attainments of pupils.
- ❑ Where residence pupils are to leave the school/residence on a planned date, they are given appropriate information, support and guidance as soon as possible after the decision has been made and up until departure, to assist in the process of transition
